A summer packed with activities is almost here! Mark your calendars for these great upcoming events:

- The Papillion Race Series kicks off with the Papillion Half Marathon, 10K and 5K on Sunday, May 19. The event takes participants on a scenic trek through the trails of Papillion and Walnut Creek Recreation Area. Registration is still open for this and other Papillion Race Series events at www.PapillionRaceSeries.com.
- SumTur Amphitheater's first free Starlight Movie, Spider-Man: Into the Spider-Verse, is May 24. Gates open at 7:30 p.m., and the movie will start at 8:45 p.m. Feel free to come early and relax on the SumTur lawn. Find more great SumTur events at www.SumTur.org.
- Papio Bay Aquatic Center's opening day is Saturday, May 25 at noon. Season passes are available now through the Papillion Recreation Department and are 10 percent off if purchased by May 15. For more information, visit www.PapioBay.org.
- The first Papillion Farmers Market is May 29 at City Park on the corner of Washington Street (84th Street) and Lincoln Street. The Papillion Farmers Market features approximately 50 vendors, including fresh produce, baked goods, local art and home-based businesses.
